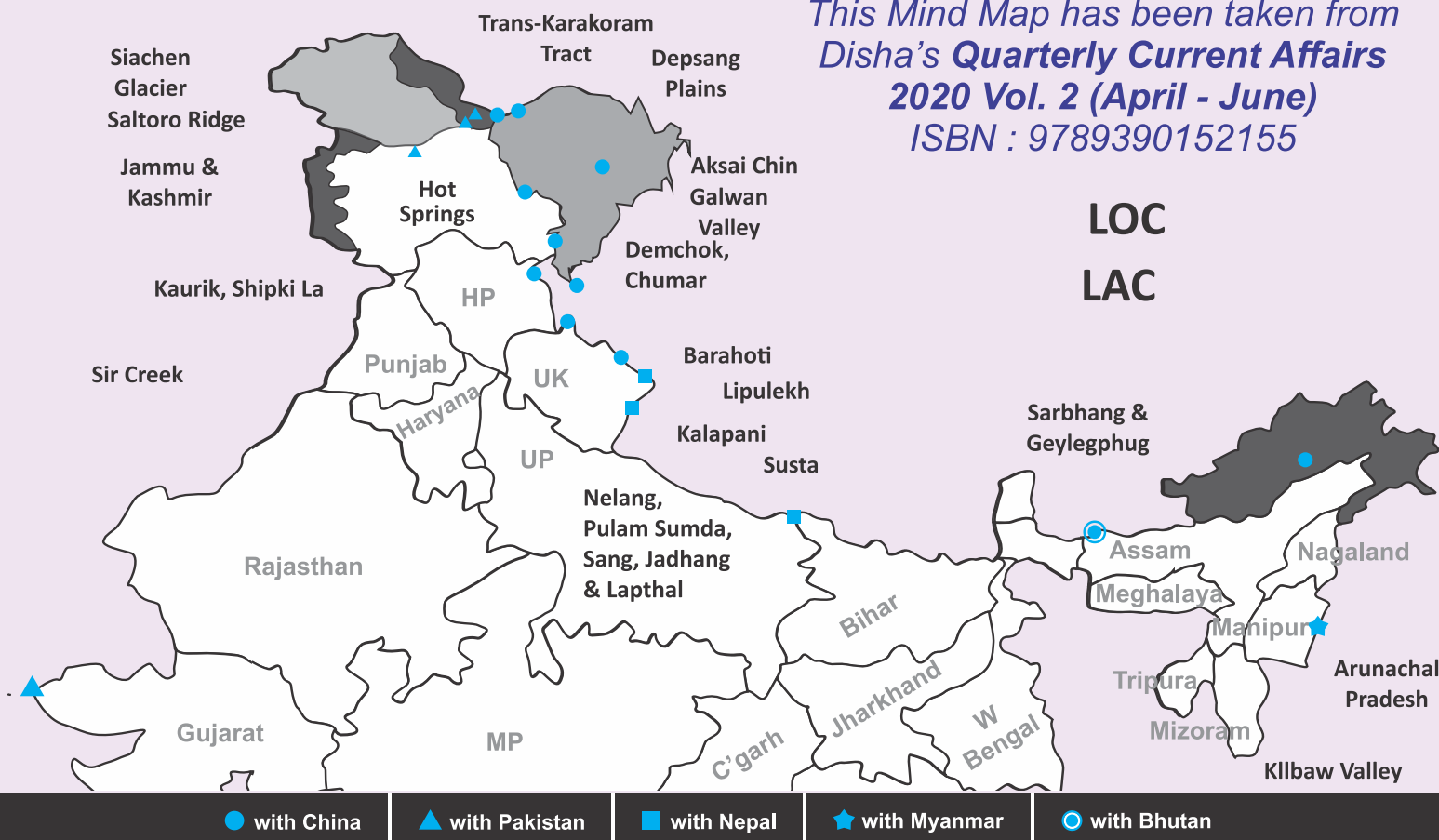

CHINA

1. Trans-Karakoram Tract - 5,800 sq km (2,239 sq mi) area. Administered by China. Pakistan gave up its claim in 1963. Claimed by India as part of Jammu and Kashmir
2. Dopsang Plains - The Chinese Army took control of most of the plains during its 1962 war with India, while India controls the western portion of the plains
3. Aksai Chin - 35,241 sq km area. Administered by China and part of Xinjiang Autonomous Region. India considers it as a part of its union territory of Ladakh
4. Demchok, Chumar - Both in Leh district of Ladakh, controlled by India
5. Kaurik, Shipki La - In Kinnour district of Himachal Pradesh
6. Nelang, Pulam Sumda, Sang, Jadhong and Lapthal - In Uttarkashi district of Uttarakhand
7. Barahoti - controlled by India
8. Arunachal Pradesh - Administered by India. Claimed by China as part of South Tibet
9. Galwan Valley - The valley refers to the land that sits between steep mountains that buffet the Galwan River. The river has its source in Aksai Chin, on China's side of the LAC, and it flows from the east to Ladakh, where it meets the Shyok river on India's side of the LAC
10. Hot Springs - Land disputed between India & China

PAKISTAN

1. Siachen Glacier - 70 km (43 mil) long. Controlled by India
2. Saltoro Ridge - Claimed by India as part of Jammu and Kashmir. And by Pakistan as part of Gilgit-Baltistan
3. Jammu and Kashmir - It is center of the major dispute between Pakistan and India
4. Sir Creek - 96 km (60 mi) strip of water. Pakistan claims the line to follow the eastern shore of the estuary while India claims a center line

NEPAL

1. Susta - 140 sq km are controlled by Nepal Claimed by India
2. Kalapani - 400 sq km area. Claimed by Nepal Administered by India
3. Lipulekh - Claimed by Nepal Administered by India
