Key Points:

- The Mahotsav was held at Cooch Behar Palace in West Bengal.
- The Mahotsav is a flagship programme of the Ministry of Culture, which was organised under the 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' Initiative.
- This Rashtriya Sanskriti Mahotsav is conducted to showcase the art and culture of one state in other states.
- This leads to promoting culture and art forms and thus helps in providing support to the artists and artisans.

PEY JAL SURVEKSHAN



Date: 17th February 2021

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs launched 'Pey Jal Survekshan' on a pilot basis.

Key Points:

- It was launched under Jal Jeevan Mission- Urban (JJM-U) in 10 Indian cities.
- The cities are: Bhubaneswar, Agra, Kochi, Madurai, Rohtak, Badlapur, Surat, Tumkur, Churu and Patiala.
- After the positive response in these cities, the survekshan will be extended to AMRUT (Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation) cities.
- The 'Pey Jal Survekshan' aims to have a distribution of water and reuse of wastewater.
- It aims to have qualitative and quantitative mapping of water bodies.
- Under this initiative, data related to drinking water, wastewater management, nonrevenue water and condition of three water bodies in the city will be collected through face-to-face interviews with citizens and municipal officials.
- Also, the water samples will be collected and will be tested in labs to check the quality of water in these cities.

'MAA SCHEME' - WEST BENGAL


The Government of West Bengal launched 'Maa Scheme'.

Key Points:

- Under this scheme, the state government will provide subsidized cooked meals to the poor people at the cost of Rs 5.
- The total funds allotted for 'Maa Scheme' by the state government is Rs 100 crores.
- The state government will bear the subsidy of Rs 15 a per plate of meal.
- The meal will be having nutritious food items like rice, dal, vegetable and egg curry which will help to maintain the nutritional value of food for poor people.

PLI SCHEME FOR TELECOM AND NETWORKING PRODUCTS



Date: 18th February 2021

The Union Cabinet has approved the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for Telecom and Networking Products (T&N Products) with a budgetary outlay of Rs. 12,195 crore.

Key Points:

- The Scheme intends to promote the manufacture of T&N Products in India.
- It proposes a financial incentive to boost domestic manufacturing and attract investments in the target segments in order to encourage Make in India.
- The scheme will also encourage exports.
- There will be a minimum investment threshold of Rs.10 crore for MSME with incentives from 7% to 4 % and Rs. 100 crore for others with incentives from 6% to 4 % over 5 year above Base Year.
- The applicants with higher investments than specified threshold under MSME and Non MSME categories will be selected through a transparent process.

INFRASTRUCTURE

PM MODI LAUNCHED 'MAHABAHU-BRAHMAPUTRA' PROGRAMME



Date: 19th February 2021

Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the 'Mahabahu-Brahmaputra' programme. He also laid the foundation stone of the Dhubri Phulbari bridge and Majuli-Jorhat bridge in Assam.

Key Points:

- 'Mahabahu-Brahmaputra' Programme is launched to strengthen water connectivity in Assam and adjoining region by using water of River Brahmaputra and Barak. The total funds allotted for this programme is Rs 3231 crore.
- The programme is having various initiatives linked with it.
- The initiatives under the programme are: (a) Ro-Pax services (b) Permanent inland water terminal at Jogighopa (c) Construction of tourist jetties
- Dhubri Phulbari Bridge will be a 4 lane bridge which will be constructed over River Brahmaputra. It will be India's longest bridge with the length of 19.282 km.
- It will offer connectivity between Dhubri in Assam and Pulbari in Meghalaya. It will be constructed with the cost of around Rs 4997 crore.

DELIMITATION OF UT OF J&K



Date: 19th February 2021

The Delimitation Commission held a meeting recently with the Associate Members from UT of J&K to seek their suggestion on the process of delimitation in respect of the UT.

Key Points:

- Delimitation is the act of redrawing boundaries of Lok Sabha and state Assembly seats.
- The objective of delimitation is to provide equal representation to equal segments of a population; fair division of geographical areas so that one political party doesn't have an advantage over others in an election.
- Constitutional provisions: Under Article 82, the Parliament enacts a Delimitation Act after every Census.
- Delimitation is carried out by an independent Delimitation Commission.
- Delimitation Commissions have been set up four times 1952, 1963, 1973 and 2002
- There was no delimitation after the 1981 and 1991 Censuses.

ASIA ENVIRONMENTAL ENFORCEMENT AWARD-2020

The Wildlife Crime Control Bureau (WCCB) has received the Asia Environmental Enforcement Award-2020.

Key Points:

- The award is given by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP).
- WCCB got the award twice in three years.
- It has been awarded this year under the Innovation category.
- Wildlife Crime Control Bureau (WCCB) is a statutory body constituted under the WildLife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- It is mandated to combat organized wildlife crime in the country.

HYDERABAD EMERGES AS TREE CITIES OF THE WORLD

Hyderabad has won a green contest among cities in India, and emerged one of the 'Tree Cities of the World'.

Key Points:

- The Award is given by the Arbor Day Foundation and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO).
- Hyderabad has maintained urban forestry under its Haritha Haram programme and its Urban Forest Parks plan.
- The city was evaluated on five metrics: 'Establish Responsibility', 'Set the Rules', 'Know What You Have', 'Allocate the Resources', and 'Celebrate the Achievements'.

PM INAUGURATED AND LAID FOUNDATION STONE FOR PROJECTS IN KERALA

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for key projects in Kerala.

- The key projects are related to the power sector and the urban sector in Kerala.
- PM Modi dedicated the Pugalur-Thrissur Power Transmission project to the nation.
 It is a 320 KV Voltage Source Converter which is based on the High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC).
- PM Modi also inaugurated 50MW Kasaragod Solar Power Project. It is developed under the National Solar Energy Mission.

- He also inaugurated the 750 MLD Water Treatment Plant at Aruvikkara. It is developed under AMRUT Mission.

- The forum was held to build a roadmap for the future to enhance technology usage and to build the trust of people in technology.
- The Forum was addressed by PM Modi in which around 1600 participants from 30 nations participated in the forum.

DRONES FOR AGRICULTURE



Date: 21st February 2021

The Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) and Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has granted conditional exemption for Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (RPAS) usage to the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare (MoAFW).

Key Points:

- The permission allows drone deployment by the MoAFW for remote sensing data collection in agricultural areas of 100 districts of the country, for Gram Panchayat level yield estimation, under Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY).
- The exemption shall be valid from the one year from the date of issue of the permission letter or until the operationalisation of the Digital Sky Platform, whichever is earlier.
- However, this exemption shall be valid only if all conditions and limitations are strictly adhered to.
- In case of violation of any condition, this exemption shall become null & void and action may be initiated as per Para 18 of the above mentioned CAR.

25 CITIES SELECTED FOR 'NURTURING NEIGHBOURHOODS CHALLENGE' COHORT



Date: 21st February 2021

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) announced the names of 25 Indian cities which are selected for Nurturing Neighbourhoods Challenge cohort.

- The Nurturing Neighbourhoods Challenge cohort is hosted by Smart Cities Mission of MoHUA in partnership with Bernard van Leer Foundation (BvLF) and World Resources Institute (WRI) India being the technical partner.
- The Nurturing Neighbourhoods Challenge cohort is a 3-year initiative that aims to support early childhood-friendly neighbourhoods under the GOP's Smart Cities Mission.

- The challenge will help the selected cities to undertake neighbourhood-level pilot projects in public space, mobility, and access to services to uplift the physical and psychological health of young children and their caregivers.
- The cities will be developing parks and open spaces, anganwadis, early childhood facilities, early childhood amenities, walkable streets for young children and their caregivers, bus shelters and transit hubs, seating, and lactation cubicles and many more.

ENROLMENT MODULE FOR TECHNOGRAHIS

Recently, the Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs has launched the Enrolment Module for TECHNOGRAHIS.

- The LightHouse Projects (LHPs) are being built as part of the Global Housing Technology Challenge-India (GHTC- India) initiative under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U).
- TECHNOGRAHIS are students from IITs, NITs, engineering, planning and architecture colleges, faculty members, academicians, and stakeholders.
- Significance of Enrolment Module for Technograhis: The interested candidates can register themselves to visit the Live Laboratories at six LHP sites for learning, consultation, generation of ideas and solutions, experimentation, innovation, and technical awareness.
- It will help students in getting a first-hand account of the technologies being used and
 in turn, they can adapt and adopt them as per their requirements in the construction
 sector for a 'Make in India' approach'.
- The promotion of LHP sites is aimed to encourage large scale participation of people to create technical awareness for on-site learning.

INDIA SUCCESSFULLY TEST FIRED 'HELINA' AND 'DHRUVASTRA'



Date: 21st February 2021

India successfully test-fired indigenously-developed Anti-Tank Guided Missile (ATGM) systems 'Helina' and 'Dhruvastra'.

Key Points:

- This has led to their induction in the Indian Army and the Indian Air Force.
- The testing trials were conducted from the Advanced Light Helicopter at Pokhran deserts of Rajasthan.
- Both the ATGM systems are having the all-weather day-and-night capability.
- They can defeat battle tanks with a conventional armour and explosive reactive armour.
- The Helina ATGM is the Army version and Dhruvastra ATGM is the Air Force version.
- Both the ATGMs are designed and developed indigenously by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).

CSIR SIGNED MOU WITH BILL & MELINDA GATES FOUNDATION



Date: 22nd February 2021

The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) has signed an MoU with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

Key Points:

- They have entered into an agreement to uplift the health development activities and promote health research in India.
- Both organisations will work to identify scientific and technological opportunities which can be used in the health sector.
- They will focus on developing and testing new preventions, therapies and interventions which will help to tackle health issues in India and in other nations.
- They will perform research on genetic diseases that impact infant and neonatal mortality; new diagnostics and devices for infectious disease and environmental surveillance; development of cost-effective processes for drug, vaccines, biologics, and diagnostics manufacturing; novel microbiome-directed foods; the socioeconomic impact of science and technological tools; and other areas of health and development.

India signed MoU with Australia to boost partnership in Civil Space Activities.

Key Points:

- In this regard, MoU was signed between the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and the Australian Space Agency.
- Both the entities will work in the sectors of civil space research, technology development for space, capability development in space, education activities and the use of outer space to have peace.
- The MoU is basically an amendment of the '2012 India Australia Inter-Governmental MoU for Cooperation in Civil Space Science, Technology and Education

COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC COOPERATION AND PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT (CECPA)



Date: 19th February 2021

The Union Cabinet has approved signing of the Comprehensive Economic Cooperation and Partnership Agreement (CECPA) between India and Mauritius.

Key Points:

- The India-Mauritius CECPA will be the first trade Agreement to be signed by India with any African country.
- It is a limited agreement.
- It will cover Trade in Goods, Rules of Origin, Trade in Services, Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT), Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) measures, Dispute Settlement, Movement of Natural Persons, Telecom, Financial services, Customs Procedures and Cooperation in other Areas.
- CECPA provides for an institutional mechanism to encourage and improve trade between the two countries.
- Both sides have also agreed to negotiate an Automatic Trigger Safeguard Mechanism (ATSM) for a limited number of highly sensitive products within two years of the Signing of the Agreement.

11TH WORLD PETROCOAL CONGRESS & WORLD FUTURE FUEL SUMMIT 2021

The Joint Conference of the 11th World PetroCoal Congress and World Future Fuel Summit was held in New Delhi.

- He has been on the Indian team negotiating issues such as biological diversity, climate change, desertification, education, energy, forestry, health, human rights, human settlements, intellectual property, international law, labour, ozone depletion, sustainable development and trade.
- Malhotra first joined the Indian Foreign Services in 1977.
- He has previously served as ambassador to Russia, Kuwait, Ambassador and Deputy Permanent Representative to the United Nations, New York and Romania.

SIX ELEPHANTS DIED IN KARLAPAT WILDLIFE SANCTUARY



Date: 16th February 2021

Key Highlights:

- Recently, six elephants died of Haemorrhagic Septicaemia (HS) in Karlapat Wildlife Sanctuary.
- Haemorrhagic septicaemia (HS) is a disease which infects animals that come in contact with contaminated water or soil by a contagious bacteria (Pasteurella multocida).
- In this disease the respiratory tract and lungs of the animals are affected, leading to severe pneumonia.
- It mainly affects water buffalo, cattle and bison with a high mortality rate in infected animals.
- Recently, around 40 buffaloes had succumbed to the infection in Odisha's Kendrapara.
- The disease generally spreads in the period right before and after the monsoons.
- Karlapat Wildlife Sanctuary is spread over 175 square kilometre area in Odisha's Kalahandi district.

GANGETIC RIVER DOLPHIN





Key Highlights:

- Recently, a Gangetic Dolphin was beaten to death in Pratapgarh, Uttar Pradesh, which is a punishable offence under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.
- Ganges river dolphins live in the Ganges-Brahmaputra-Meghna and Karnaphuli-Sangu river systems of Nepal, India, and Bangladesh.
- The Ganges river dolphin can only live in freshwater and is essentially blind.
- They hunt by emitting ultrasonic sounds, which bounces off of fish and other prey, enabling them to "see" an image in their mind. They are also called 'susu'.
- Population of Gangetic river Dolphin is 1200-1800.
- It is a reliable indicator of the health of the entire river ecosystem.
- It was recognised as the National Aquatic Animal in 2009, by the Government of India.

GREENPEACE ANALYSIS OF COST TO THE ECONOMY DUE TO AIR POLLUTION

Key Highlights:


 Greenpeace Southeast Asia recently carried out an analysis of cost to the economy due to air pollution.

- According to the report, Air pollution claimed approximately 54,000 lives in Delhi in 2020.
- Six Indian cities Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Chennai, Hyderabad and Lucknow feature in the global analysis.
- Globally, approximately 1,60,000 deaths have been attributed to PM (particulate matter) 2.5 air pollution.
- These deaths have occurred in the five most populous cities Delhi, Mexico City, São Paulo, Shanghai and Tokyo.
- The 'Cost Estimator' tool was used for the study. It is an online tool that estimates the real-time health impact and economic cost from fine PM 2.5 air pollution in major world cities.

REPORT ON ROAD ACCIDENTS: WORLD BANK



Date: 16th February 2021

Key Highlights:

- Recently, the Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways released the World Bank Report titled "Traffic Crash Injuries And Disabilities: The Burden on India Society".
- The Report has been prepared in collaboration with the NGO-Save Life Foundation.
- The survey data was collected from four Indian states i.e. Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra.
- According to the report, India accounts for 11% of the global death in road accidents, the highest in the world.
- Amounting to about 4.5 lakh road crashes per annum, in which 1.5 lakh people die.

- It leads to an estimated economic loss of about 3.14% of Gross Domestic Product (GDP), indicating an underreporting phenomenon in the country.
- The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) estimates socioeconomic cost of Road Crashes is equivalent to 0.77% of the GDP.

UK TO CONDUCT FIRST HUMAN CHALLENGE TRIALS FOR COVID-19



Date: 19th February 2021

Key Highlights:

- The UK is set to conduct the first COVID-19 human challenge trials (HCT) within a month from now.
- The trial was first announced in October 2020.
- In this study, over 90 healthy volunteers between the ages of 18-30 will be deliberately exposed to small amounts of the virus in controlled settings.
- Its objective is to test treatments and vaccines.
- In this way, the participants are "challenged" by the virus.
- This is not the same as standard vaccine clinical trials.
- HCTs are able to give more precise information about the disease and its effects on humans, and also give results about the efficacy of vaccines on infected humans.

ARJUN MAIN BATTLE TANK (MK-1A)

- The secondary weapons include machine guns for anti-personnel and antiaircraft and ground targets.
- The Mk-1A version has 14 major upgrades on the earlier version.


Key Features:

- Delhi Police have named environmental activists Disha Ravi, Nikita Jacob, and Shantanu Muluk, who are volunteers of this global environment movement.
- The Extinction Rebellion, also referred to as 'XR' was initially launched in the United Kingdom on October 31, 2018, as a response to a report by the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC).
- Now, it is a global movement which seeks to "rebel", and asks groups to "self-organise", without the need for anyone's permission, to come up with collective action plans as long as they adhere to the group's core principles and values.
- It is a decentralised, international and politically non-partisan movement using non-violent direct action and civil disobedience to persuade governments to act justly on the Climate and Ecological Emergency.
