OPERATION 'SAMUDRA SETU-II'



Date: 3rd May 2021

The Indian Navy commenced operation 'Samudra Setu-II' to bring oxygen-filled cryogenic containers to India from abroad nations.

- This operation was launched to help to tackle the medical oxygen crisis being faced by India during the second wave of the pandemic.
- Under this operation, the warships will undertake shipment of liquid Oxygen filled cryogenic containers & associated medical equipment to India to support tackling COVID-19.
- Seven Indian Naval ships have been deployed for shipment of liquid medical oxygen-filled cryogenic containers and associated medical equipment from various countries.
- These warships are Kolkata, Kochi, Talwar, Tabar, Trikand, Jalashwa and Airavat.

'CO-JEET' OPERATION



Date: 6th May 2021

The operation named 'CO-JEET' was launched by the Armed Forces to aid COVID-19 efforts.

Key Points:

- The operation is being executed to strengthen the medical system in India and to help GOI to tackle the second wave of the pandemic, thus to save the lives of people.
- The oxygen supplies are being made available to the patients suffering from coronavirus.
- The CO-JEET operation also helps people to maintain their mental well being.
- The 3rd woman to become a three-star general in the armed forces, Lt. Gen. Dr Madhuri Kanitkar is working to execute the CO-JEET Operation.

'PARVAT DHARA YOJANA' – HIMACHAL PRADESH



Date: 4th May 2021

The Himachal Pradesh's Government has initiated 'Parvat Dhara Yojana' to revive, recharge aquifers and conserve the water resources of the state.

Key Points:

- The main motto of this yojana is to increase the water level by retaining it in water bodies for a long period.
 - The 'Parvat Dhara Yojana' will be implemented in 10 districts of the state with an outlay of Rs 20 crore.
- The scheme will be implemented by the forest department of the state.
- Under this scheme, irrigation facilities will be provided in sloping fields.

'AURO SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME'



Date: 5th May 2021

The Education Ministry of Tripura launched the 'Auro Scholarship Programme'.

Key Points:

- The programme is an initiative of the Sri Aurobindo Society and was launched for all the students of the state.
- The 'Auro Scholarship Programme' will grant micro-scholarship to the students which will motivate them to gain better learning practices and solutions.
- The programme will be executed through Auro Scholar App.
- It will grant micro-scholarship to the K-12 students who achieve remarkable performance in a 10 min curriculum-based quiz which will be conducted via the app.
- The parents will receive upto Rs 1000 per month in their bank accounts (Rs 50 per quiz for 20 quizzes in 5 subjects).

MOORHEN YOGA MAT



Date: 4th May 2021

A biodegradable and compostable yoga mat was recently developed from water hyacinth from the fishing community in Assam.

Key Points:

- The mat is called 'Moorhen Yoga Mat'
- It will soon be introduced to the world market as a unique product.
- The intervention was triggered through an initiative by North East Centre for Technology Application and Reach (NECTAR), an autonomous body under Department of Science & Technology (DST) to involve the entire women community associated with a collective called 'Simang' meaning dream, led by the 6 girls to create wealth from water hyacinth plants.
- Water hyacinth is considered as a nuisance since it does not benefit the fishing community and harms their occupation.

PETROLEUM MINISTER INAUGURATED 1ST SUPPLY OF UCO BASED BIODIESEL



Date: 6th May 2021

Union Minister of Petroleum & Natural Gas, Dharmendra Pradhan flagged off the first supply of UCO (Used Cooking Oil) based Biodiesel blended Diesel in a virtual manner.

- It was flagged off under the EOI (Expression of Interests) Scheme from Indian Oil's Tikrikalan Terminal.
- This supply will help to develop an ecosystem to collect and convert UCO into biodiesel. This will also increase job opportunities.
- Along with this, India has set a target to attain a 5% blending of biodiesel by 2030.
- The EoIs for "Procurement of Biodiesel produced from Used Cooking Oil (UCO)" was initiated by the Petroleum Ministry.

UNIQUE DISABILITY ID (UDID)



Date: 7th May 2021

The Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD), Government of India has made it mandatory for all States/UTs to grant certificate of disability through online mode only using UDID portal from 1st June.

Key Points:

- The Central Government notified the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 under RPwD Act, 2016.
- Rule 18(5) mandates the Central Government to appoint a date making it mandatory for the State/UT authorities to issue certificate of disability through online mode.
- The UDID project has been under implementation since 2016.
- It will ensure complete digitization of certification of disability from 01.06.2021, besides providing a viable mechanism for cross-checking genuineness of the certificate to achieve pan-India validity, and simplifying the process for the benefit of Divyangjan.

THE GLOBAL FOREST GOAL<mark>S REPO</mark>RT 2021: UN REPORT



Date: 1st May 2021

The Global Forest Goals Report 2021 has been prepared by the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the United Nations. It provides an initial overview of progress of Goals and targets contained within the United Nations Strategic Plan for Forests 2030.

- As per the report, Covid-19 pandemic has aggravated the challenges faced by countries in managing their forests.
- More than just a health crisis, Covid-19 is driving losses of lives and livelihoods, extreme poverty, inequality, and food insecurity, and it has put the 'Future We Want' further out of reach.
- It is estimated that world gross product fell by an estimated 4.3% in 2020. It is the sharpest contraction of global output since the Great Depression.

On the economic front, forest-dependent populations have faced job loss, reduced income, diminished access to markets and information, and for many women and youth, a contraction in seasonal employment.

Date: 2nd May 2021


The Union Minister of Electronics and Information Technology, Ravi Shankar Prasad represented India at G7 Digital and Technology Ministerial Meeting.

Key Points:

- Proclaimed by the UN General Assembly in December 1993, following the recommendation of UNESCO's General Conference.
- World Press Freedom Day commemorates the field of journalism and the struggle faced by journalists who have risked their lives to seek and bring true stories to the world.
- The theme of World Press Freedom Day 2021 is "Information as a Public Good". The theme focuses on the importance of cherishing information as a public good and explores ways to strengthen journalism.

UNION CABINET APPROVED MOU BETWEEN INDIA AND UK



Date: 4th May 2021

The Union Cabinet chaired by PM Modi approved the MoU between India and the United Kingdom on information sharing and Custom Cooperation.

- Under this MoU, information sharing will be made available to prevent and investigate customs offences.
- This will also lead to having seamless trading activities between both nations.
- The MoU will provide a legal framework for sharing of information and intelligence between the Customs authorities of both nations.
- The MoU will also lead to developing the proper application of Customs laws and the facilitation of legitimate trade.

1ST IND-FRA-AUS TRILATERAL FOREIGN MINISTERIAL DIA-LOGUE



Date: 7th May 2021

The 1st India-France-Australia Trilateral Ministerial Dialogue was held recently on the sidelines of the G7 Foreign Ministers' Meeting.

Key Points:

- The Indian delegation was led by Union External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar with his French and Australian counterparts Jean-Yves Le Drian and Marise Payne, respectively.
- The dignitaries held a discussion about the Indo-Pacific strategic landscape.
- At the dialogue, the External Affairs Minister of India appreciated and thanked the efforts from France and Australia to tackle the pandemic situation in India.
- They assured to boost cooperation in Indo-Pacific strategic landscape, to have open and rule-based Indo-Pacific ties.
- France and Australia also appreciated India's positive contribution to supply COVID-19 vaccines to various countries globally.

DEFENCE

P-8I PATROL AIRCRAFT



Date: 5th May 2021

The U.S. State Department approved the proposed sale of six P-8I patrol aircraft and related equipment to India, a deal estimated to cost \$2.42 billion.

- In November 2019, the Defence Acquisition Council, approved the procurement of the long-range maritime surveillance aircraft manufactured by Boeing.
- The possible sale comes through the Foreign Military Sale route and requires that the U.S. Congress be notified.
- With India having signed the Communications Compatibility and Security Agreement (COMCASA) foundational agreement with the U.S., the six aircraft will come fitted with encrypted systems.
- The P-8I is based on the Boeing 737 commercial aircraft and India was its first international customer.



Why in news: Appointed as Acting Chairperson of the NHRC.

Key Points:

- The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) member Justice (retired) Prafulla Chandra Pant had been appointed as the acting chairperson of the Commission.
- A former Supreme Court judge, Justice Pant was appointed as a member of the NHRC in April 2019.
- The post of a chairperson has been vacant since Justice H.L. Dattu, a former Chief Justice of India, completed his tenure in December 2020.

Date: 1st May 2021 'Shooter Dadi' Chandro Tomar passed away. He was 89.

Key Points:

- Shooter Chandro Tomar, nicknamed 'Shooter Dadi'.
- She was Hailing from the Baghpat village in Uttar Pradesh.
- Tomar was already 60-plus when she picked up a gun for the first time but went on to win many national competitions, even inspiring a Bollywood movie on her life.
- Her feats ultimately inspired the award-winning Bollywood movie 'Saand ki Aankh'.
- Shooter Dadi won many awards in the senior citizen category including Stri Shakti Sanman presented by the President of India.

MANAS BIHARI VERMA



Date: 3rd May 2021

The Indian aeronautical scientist, Manas Bihari Verma Passed away. He was 78.

- He played a key role in the development of the country's first Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) 'Tejas',
- He worked as a scientist at the Defence Research Development Organization (DRDO) for 35 years in the aeronautical stream.
- He was given the responsibility for the design of the Tejas aircraft mechanical system, where he led the team responsible for the full-scale engineering development of the Tejas aircraft in the Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA).
- Verma had launched "Mobile Science Laboratory" (MSL) vans in 2010 in the rural areas of Bihar to impart knowledge in science to children.
- He retired as Director of ADA in 2005.
- He was conferred with Padma Shri award in March 2018.

MARIA RESSA HONORED

Why in news: Honored with the 2021 UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize.

Key Points:

- Investigative journalist and media executive Maria Ressa of the Philippines has been named as the 2021 laureate of the UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize.
- The \$25,000 Prize recognizes outstanding contributions to the defence or promotion of press freedom especially in the face of danger.
- Ressa was chosen because Over a career spanning more than thirty years, Ressa has worked as CNN's lead investigative reporter for Asia and the head of ABS-CBN News and Current Affairs.
- She has also been involved in many international initiatives to promote press freedom.
- In recent years, she has been the target of online attacks and judicial processes relating to her investigative reporting and status as manager of online outlet Rappler.

- The Badminton World Federation announced that India shuttler PV Sindhu and Canada's Michelle Li have been nominated as athlete ambassadors for the International Olympic Committee's (IOC) 'Believe in Sport' campaign.
- Sindhu and Li will be working alongside other athlete ambassadors from around the world to raise awareness on the topic of competition manipulation amongst athletes and encourage.
- The pair have been global ambassadors for BWF's 'i am badminton' campaign since April 2020.
- The IOC's 'Believe in Sport' campaign was launched in 2018 to raise awareness among athletes, coaches and officials of the threat of competition manipulation.

MARATHA QUOTA UNCONSTITUTIONAL, SAYS SC



Date: 5th May 2021

Key Highlights:

- A five-judge Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court has struck down the Maharashtra law granting reservation to the Maratha community in admissions and government jobs in the state.
- In November 2018, the Maratha community was given the reservation under the Maharashtra State Socially and Educationally Backward Act.
- The special act was sanctioned by Maharashtra State Backward Class Commission and approved in both the assembly and council.
- The Maratha reservation of 12 and 13 per cent (in education and jobs) had increased the overall reservation ceiling to 64 per cent and 65 per cent, respectively.

CHHATTISGARH'S VACCINATION POLICY IS BEING OPPOSED IN COURT



Date: 6th May 2021

Key Highlights:

- Chhattisgarh High Court is hearing intervention applications filed by politicians and lawyers against the state government's vaccination policy.
 As per the policy, the state government will administer the vaccines based on the economic situation of the citizens.
- Under this, vaccination of people between 18-44 years of age would be held in three stages.
- Firstly, the Antyodaya Card holders are to be vaccinated. Followed by the BPL card holders. Then the APL card holders.
- The opposition argue that this sub-classification is beyond the constitutional mandate and is patently in violation of the law of equality and equal opportunity before law.

BORDER DISPUTE BETWEEN KYRGYZSTAN AND TAJIKISTAN



Date: 3rd May 2021

Key Highlights:

- At least 31 people have been killed in Kyrgyzstan in heavy clashes at its disputed border with Tajikistan.
- More than a third of the two countries' border is disputed, with the area surrounding the Vorukh, where recent conflict erupted.
- It is a regular flashpoint over territorial claims and access to water.
- Vorukh is a jamoat (administrative division) in northern Tajikistan.
- It is an enclave surrounded by Kyrgyzstan that forms part of the city of Isfara in the Sughd Region.
- The location of the border of the enclave is disputed by the Tajik and Kyrgyz governments.

CONGO DECLARES END OF LATEST EBOLA OUTBREAK



Date: 6th May 2021

Key Highlights:

- The Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) has officially declared the end of the 12th Ebola outbreak.
- Since the outbreak declared in February, 2021, a total of 12 cases have been reported.
- Thanks to the experience of the DRC's response team and health partners, the epidemic has been brought under control in less than three months after its declaration.
- Ebola virus disease (EVD), formerly known as Ebola haemorrhagic fever, is a severe, often fatal illness in humans.
- The virus is transmitted to people from wild animals and spreads in the human population through human-to-human transmission.

TALIBAN HAS CAPTURED AFGHANISTAN'S SECOND-BIGGEST DAM

Date: 7th May 2021

Key Highlights:

- The Taliban has captured Afghanistan's second-biggest dam (Dahla Dam) after months of fierce fighting in its former bastion of Kandahar.
- It provides irrigation to farmers via a network of canals as well as drinking water for the provincial capital
- It is now under Taliban control.
- The dam's capture comes after clashes erupted in neighbouring Helmand province just days after the U.S. military formally began withdrawing its remaining troops from Afghanistan.
- The Dahla Dam is also known as Arghandab Dam is located in the Kandahar Province, Afghanistan.

DRONE DELIVERY OF COVID-19 VACCINES



Date: 1st May 2021

Key Features:

- Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) and Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) have granted conditional exemption for drone deployment to the Government of Telangana for Experimental delivery of Covid-19 Vaccines.
- The permission has been granted within Visual Line of Sight (VLOS) Range using drones.
- It is valid for a period of one year or until further orders.
- Earlier this month, similar permission was granted to the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) for conducting feasibility study of Covid-19 vaccine delivery using drones in collaboration with IIT Kanpur.
- The grant of these permissions is intended to achieve the dual objectives of faster vaccine delivery & improved healthcare access.

CONVERTING NITROGEN PLANTS TO OXYGEN PLANTS




Date: 2nd May 2021

Key Features:

- Considering the requirement of medical oxygen amidst the COVID-19 pandemic situation, the Government of India explored the feasibility of conversion of existing nitrogen plants to produce oxygen.
- Potential industries, wherein existing nitrogen plants may be converted for production of oxygen, were identified.
- In the nitrogen plants Carbon Molecular Sieve (CMS) is used whereas Zeolite Molecular Sieve (ZMS) is required for producing oxygen.
- Therefore, by replacing CMS with ZMS and carrying out few other changes such as oxygen analyzer, control panel system, flow valves etc. existing nitrogen plants can be modified to produce oxygen.

'OXYGEN ON WHEELS' PROJECT



Date: 3rd May 2021

- The 'Oxygen on Wheels' project was rolled out by Mahindra group chairman Anand Mahindra.
- The project was launched to ease the transportation of oxygen from producing plants to hospitals and homes.
- The Mahindra Group aims to support India to tackle the pandemic situation and in this regard it has launched this operation.
- This project will help to reduce the gap between the requirement and shortage of oxygen, especially in Maharashtra.
- The project will be executed by using trucks in local shuttle routes to connect oxygen producers with hospitals and homes.



COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY SCAN



Date: 7th May 2021

Key Features:

 CT scans have been in news since several Covid positive patients with mild to moderate Covid symptoms, and some with negative RT-PCR reports having Covid symptoms are coming for the test.

- **CT** scan is also known as computed tomography scan.
- It is a medical imaging technique used in radiology to get detailed images of the body noninvasively for diagnostic purposes.
 - **CT** scanners use a rotating x-ray tube and a row of detectors placed in the gantry to measure X-ray attenuations by different tissues inside the body. The multiple X-ray measurements taken from different angles are then processed on a computer using reconstruction algorithms to produce tomographic (cross-sectional) images (virtual "slices") of a body.
